

Discovering Québec City

Dear Parents,

SEM is pleased to announce a travel opportunity entitled "Discovering Québec City." Students will explore language, culture, and identity in Francophone North America. From gastronomy in the "Cabanes à sucre" to historic sites such as "Les Plaines d'Abraham," students will find an authentic French city offering French Canadian culture, history, and architecture. Please note that your daughter does not need to take French to participate to this trip.

The foreign language department is excited to offer this opportunity and our goal is for students to make the most of it. Participating students should be ready to take an active role in their discovery - they will engage in a variety of instructional activities. Students are expected to adhere to SEM's social honor code on this program and follow all school rules.

Students will leave for Québec City on Thursday, January 11, 2024, late evening and will return on Sunday, January 14, in the evening. 50 students are eligible to participate. I, Isabelle Fisher, along with Ms. Cunningham, Ms. Mathias, and Mrs. Leslie will accompany the group. Applications will be processed by prioritizing seniors first, then juniors, sophomores, and freshmen with a strict deadline of a \$50 deposit on October 19, 2023. Keep in mind that we will offer this trip every other year, so if your daughter can't go this year, she can reapply in 2026. If your daughter is accepted to participate, you will receive an email by October 23, with detailed payment information. Students currently on academic or behavioral probation are not eligible to participate.

The price for this program depends on the number of participants. This price includes all expenses related to travel, excursions, hotel accommodations, and meals as noted in the itinerary. The price does <u>not</u> include spending money in Québec City, food purchases as noted in itinerary, and emergency medical services.

ITINERARY QUÉBEC CITY 2024

THURSDAY, JANUARY 11

Depart Buffalo Seminary School late this evening via chartered motorcoach for Quebec City. Meal/rest stops (individual's expense) will be coordinated between the teacher chaperones and the bus driver.

FRIDAY, JANUARY 12

Morning arrival at the hotel. Please note that rooms most likely will not be ready so your luggage will be stored, and you will return for formal check-in later this afternoon. Meet your guide at the hotel and begin your sightseeing with a guided walking tour of Old and New Quebec, including Dufferin Terrace; Place Royale and the Quartier Champlain, the site where the town was settled originally in 1608 in the Lower Town; and the Plains of Abraham, a 235-acre stretch of greenery where the English General Wolfe did battle with the French general, the Marquis de Montcalm. After time for lunch (individual's expense) your group will participate in a handson workshop entitled *Soldier of the Martello Tower*. Accompanied by British officers, you'll learn all about the living conditions of the soldiers billeted in one of the Martello Towers. The balance of the afternoon is free for shopping in small groups in Old Quebec. This evening you'll travel a short distance outside of Quebec to a sugar shack. Here you'll have a traditional Quebecois **DINNER** and entertainment! Return to your hotel later this evening.

SATURDAY, JANUARY 13

This morning you will depart Quebec City and travel northeast, along the St. Lawrence River and the Beaupre Coast. You will stop at Chez Marie for BREAKFAST, including Marie's home-baked bread and maple butter. Continue your sightseeing with visits to Montmorency Falls, the tallest falls in all of Canada, and more than one and a half times the height of Niagara! Continue to the shrine of Ste-Anne de Beaupre, where you will visit the beautiful church and surrounding area. Later this morning you will enjoy dog sledding and snowshoeing! Each person will have the opportunity to ride dogsled as well as sample one of the most traditional of Quebecois winter sports, snowshoes! After dogsledding you will continue to the Ice Hotel, the only such hotel built in North America! Following your time at the Ice Hotel you will have time for lunch (individual's expense) at the food court. After lunch you will enjoy the balance of the afternoon at the Village Vacances Valcartier snow park, where you will enjoy the slides, air tubes, carpets, and ice skating (individual's expense and weather permitting). Depart the snow park at closing and continue on to the Galeries de la Capitale for dinner (individual's expense) and for some shopping time and time for the indoor amusement park (individual's expense). Continue to your hotel later this evening where you will remain.

SUNDAY, JANUARY 14

BREAKFAST. Check out of your hotel and depart for Buffalo. Meal/rest stops (individual's expense) will be coordinated between the teacher chaperones and the bus driver. Estimated late evening arrival back at the school.
